

Duke Geoffrey I of Brittany

Eudes de Bretagne, Comte de Penthièvre, Goëlo, Avaugour et Lamballe.999 – 7.1.1079 (given Penthièvre 1035-1079 by brother). Nicknamed ‘Brito’.

Eudes was first cousin to Edward the Confessor

After death of bro, Duke Alan III, Eudes ruled as de facto Duke of Brittany 1040-1057 when Conan II, his nephew and rightful heir, imprisoned him. Freed 1062 m. Orguen 1022–1056 dau. of Alain, Comte de Cornouaille, and sister of Hoel II Duke of Brittany 1040.



Derrien, à qui l'on attribue la fondation du château de La Roche-Derrien.

In the foundation charter of 1083 by Geoffrey Boterel I, Alan's eldest brother, for the priory of Saint-Martin de Lamballe in Brittany, the signatories include:
"Gaufrerus ipse comes, Rotbertus frater eius...Haimo vicecomes..." - that is, Count Geoffrey himself, his brother Robert, and Viscount Haimo.
