b.c.1092- c.1160 illegitimate .

relating to the Danelaw" dated
1155

(Count Stephen's daughter
Maud , Hamo's cousin, was
Countess of Lincolnshire).

Hamo Rannulf Boterel
appears in London in 1155
(Alan Niger II had lands in
London)

And Hurstbourne, Hants as
farmer 1156-66

Forester of the New Forest
and Arkengarthdale,

Yorkshire, by grant of Conan,
Duke of Brittany. On his
death this honour went to

Hervey fitz-Akaris

Aimeric Boterel bastard
1070?-
1100? Henry I gave him at
coronation 5 hides of land
Abington, Northants, which
had previously belonged to

William de Lanvally
bc.1140
had knight's fee from
Aubrey de Vere and manor
of Abington, Northampton.
He was present at the
important meeting at
Clarendon with Henry and
his son in 1164. The king
appointed him seneschal in
the county of Rennes in
Brittany between 1166-71,
presumably because of his
knowledge of the area.
After his return, he was

niece of Robert Fitzwalter, a
leader of the Magna Carta
barons

in the foundation charter of 1083 by Geoffrey Boterel I, Alan's eldest brother, for the priory of Saint-Martin de Lamballe in Brittany, the signatories include: "Gauffredus ipse comes, Rotbertus frater eius...Haimo vicecomes..." - that is, Count Geoffrey himself, his brother Robert, and Viscount Haimo.

Hamo is named in an act of Duchess Bertha of Brittany 1160.
