

Geoffrey **Boterel** II 1091-1148
Count of Penthièvre and Lamballe.
m. Hawise of Dol c. 1113.

Helped Matilda against Stephen in civil war.

Eldest son, so inherited family lands in Brittany. m Vigolenta de Nettleshead
Settled in Nettleshead, Suffolk in 1139. Deed of 6 Stephen 1141
Had Brien's old lands, but now held of Alan II of Richmond
Died fighting his two brothers for 7 years

Rivallon. c.1116-1162
Co-Count of Penthièvre 1148-62

Geoffrey **Boterel** III b.1141.
Count of Penthièvre 1164-77 .
Geoffrey Boterel III? occurs in the carta
of Wallingford in 1166 (Red Book of the
Exchequer, ed. H.Hall, 3 vols., Rolls
series, 1896, i, 309). Cons Newc 1169.
Cousin of GBIV so Alan so Henri..m.
Hawise de Dol.

Co-Comte de Penthièvre 1162-1164

Peter **Boterel**
b. Staffs.1119?
Gave land to Abingdon Abbey 1154 to
expiate brother's sin. Gave certain
freedoms to Godwin at Nettlestead 1153.
Lands in Oxfordshire and Berkshire
1166. Constable of Newcastle-under-
Lyme, Staffordshire 1165. Also lands in
Yorkshire. according to Liber Niger
1167. Also Surrey 1153-64.

Ralph
of Hook Norton, Oxon.1138 – 1181–
witnessed deed of Peter to Abingdon
Abbey 1154. As a reward for helping his
father, Peter, defend Wallingford during
the civil war, Ralph (when 21?)was
enfeoffed 1159 by Lord d'Oilly at
Stonesfield, Oxfordshire with 1 knight's
fee - enough land to support himself and
his retainers (about 600 acres) in return
for giving 40 days military service per
annum 11 Hen. II 1166. But the king
needed the land for his mistress and, with

William **Boterel**
b.1118? Staffs. Constable of Wallingford
Castle, Oxfordshire1150-1157 While he
was constable at Wallingford, it
appears that the abbot of Abingdon paid
him a sum of money
on condition that he restrained his
followers from pillaging the
abbey lands. Sad to relate, William
accepted the money but his
men nevertheless raided the abbey estate
at Culham and William
refused redress. For this flagrant breach
of faith William was
excommunicated. Later, when he lay
dying of wounds, his brother
Peter sought pardon on his behalf and
offered a mill at Bensington
as compensation. William was granted a
death-bed absolution.. Went into decline
after brother's gift – died of grief. In
Lincolnshire and London 1155 with
cousin.

William de Boterel b.1144?

Ralph's agreement, swapped Stonesfield for another manor with d'Oilly, who gave Ralph a manor at Wodnesbra/Wednesbury, Staffordshire, in 1166 (12-17 Hen. II. (Pipe Eolls and Chron. of Abingdon Abbey).. Ralph also owed a nominal fee of £1 to the crown, but never paid. Granted meadow to Oseney 1164. Constable of Newcastle-under-Lyne 15 Hen. II 1169. He held land in Oxfordshire 11 Hen. II 1165.

inherited 4-9 Hen. II 1158. Sheriff of Devon. 4 Ric I. 1193 (Pipe Rolls and Chron.) m. Hawise de Whitmore (heiress) 1174. He held land in Witemore, Staffs., Sheriff of Devon

Radulph de **Botrel** fitz-Wetmore illegitimate. Castellán under Hen III.. Lands in Salop 1193, Staffs and Warwickshire. Land in W'tmore 21 Hen. II 1175. Won dispute with Reginald Boterel 5. John 1203 touching a virgate of land of his mother, which he held 15 — 17 John.. d. 1241.

William (le Burgvyllan) fil. Rad. 1241-1254. Castellán under Henry de Audley, 30 Hen III 1246. and land with his wife Ursula under Hamo le Strange, 38 Hen. III 1254. (Pipe Rolls Salop and Staff.) Lands in Whitmore, Shropshire and Newcastle, Staffordshire 21 Hen III. 1254. m. 2nd Matilda de Caux

William b. 1185? Lands in Whitmore and Newcastle 1221 under King Henry III by military service 1242 and Hen III - 1237. and in Warwickshire (Lib. Feod. and Pipe Rolls). He is also styled in Lib. Feod. " Will. Botrealus, baro. Constable of Newcastle Lord Reginald de Botrell de Wytmore, b 1204? held land by inheritance, 31 Hen. III - 1247 - also held land from the King in capite in the manor of Longedon, hundred de Ford, Shropshire, and from John Esturne in Wetemore in the same hundred, 45 Hen. III. He was fined by John Barel the sheriff 56 Hen. III. and was eventually proclaimed a rebel, temp. Edw. I. (Pipe Rolls, Staff, and Salop, and Inquis. Salop.)
